## WNYDA/CDCT FALL SYMPOSIUM WITH KRISTI WYSOCKI AT HOUGHTON EQUESTRIAN CENTER by Carol Morris

The theme of the symposium was "How to address different conformations when training the dressage horse". The horses chosen for the demo ranged from a mustang to Freisian crosses, an Akhel-Teke, an Andalusian, and several warmblood crosses. Some were at Training Level, some had been trained to Grand Prix.

Kristi is an International 4\* FEI Dressage judge and FEI 5\* Para Dressage judge who judged the Para dressage this year at the Paris Olympics. She is also a licensed Dressage Sport Horse Breed judge. She has judged numerous CDI's and CPED's in this country and internationally. On a personal level, Kristi was delightful, easy to speak with and very encouraging of all kinds of questions. I had been selected as a demo rider with Athena, but a back problem prevented me from riding, so I went along to help out. I hope to have an opportunity to ride with her in the future.

On Saturday, Kristi started out by explaining the conformation traits she looks for – the angles of the shoulder, the ratio of the top of the neck to the bottom, how the neck is set on to the chest, and the triangle formed by the point of the hip, the top of the croup, and the stifle. As each demo rider came into the ring, she would go over the conformation of the horse, and have auditors help to analyze the conformation of each according to the principles she had explained.

Here are some main takeaways, which formed the theme of her commentary for every rider. They are in no particular order.

- Hug with the calf, don't bump with the heel, especially when asking the horse to bend into the outside rein.
- Add energy, not speed.
- Each walk break should have a better walk as the training session progresses.
- To get a better trot, post higher, not faster. Try to almost pause at the top of the post.
- Trot-canter transitions help with suppling.
- COMMIT.
- In canter use your seat as if you are on a swing.
- Think about pushing a wheelbarrow or a shopping cart: push your hands out in front.
- In upward transitions, change the gait, then shorten the reins.
- In all transitions, your seat indicates the gait.
- In schooling half-pass, only go to the center line so you can go straight afterwards.
- If we don't change something, nothing will change. If what you are doing doesn't work, do something different.
- Tickle with the whip behind the leg, not on the rump especially with a mare. Flick the whip with a steady hand that does not move backward and pull on the bit. Practice this out of the saddle.
- The seat dictates the gait. The legs add activity.
- Think of you and your horse as a team. "We" are doing <whatever>, not "my horse" or "I". It's more fun when "WE" do it.

- In half-pass, inside leg at the horse's armpit, weight on the inside seatbone. Imagine you are changing
- lanes on the highway; the car stays parallel to the lanes.
- We can make our horses spook faster than they can. Be brave.
- Practice lead changes on the ground. This will help with timing of the aids in flying changes.

We had a lovely taco buffet dish-to-pass dinner, and Kristi chatted about her experience in Paris, and some of the challenges facing dressage. Importantly, she suggested that no one post videos online, as they can be doctored and used by those who would like to see dressage eliminated, not only from the Olympics, but from all competition.

For ongoing education, Kristi recommended the book Sacred Spaces by Susan Fay. She also has a YouTube channel which she invited participants to subscribe to.

Many thanks to CDCT, WNYDA and Houghton for collaborating to present this interesting symposium. If you have an opportunity to ride or audit with Kristi, I highly recommend that you take it.
